# Scholarship with Survivors Workshop

A Day of Conversation between Early Career Researchers and Survivors

University of Nottingham, UK

Saturday 20 October 2018

## The workshop

There is a lot of research done by universities and governments on slavery and the experiences of survivors. But, too often survivors are left out of this conversation or only included in small ways. With the Scholarship with Survivors Workshop, we hope to start changing this by opening discussions between survivors and early career researchers to create more inclusive research in the future.

Throughout the day, we will:

- Get to know one another in an informal environment where everyone is on equal footing;
- Have a panel session where survivors can speak on how they would like to see research on slavery progressing in the future, including the role of survivors in this work, followed by a Q&A session; and
- Spend the afternoon in smaller discussion groups where survivors and researchers can discuss important areas of research, goals and challenges, as well as the ways that survivors and researchers can work together in this field.

## Call for participants

We would like to invite survivors of slavery and human trafficking to join us in Nottingham, to participate in the workshop and become part of a growing network of early career researchers working in the area.

- You are welcome to attend as a general participant or as a presenter on the survivor panel.
- As a participant, you **will not** be required to tell everyone that you are a survivor of slavery. You are welcome to, if you'd like. Please note, that sometimes, depending on what you say, it will become clear to others that you are a survivor. For example, if you say, "At the Town Hall Meeting" or "After I escaped..."
